

**Brookfield Show Society
Stud Beef Cattle**

Rules and regulations

DPI notice: Tuberculosis and Brucellosis Cattle from a herd restricted for either of these diseases will not be allowed entry to the showgrounds.

No cattle will be allowed entry to the Brookfield Showgrounds and associated parks unless accompanied by a fully completed Waybill as prescribed by the Stock Act – 1915.

NOTICE to Exhibitors:

All cattle must be carrying an approved NLIS device (ear tag or bolus) and will be scanned on arrival and departure (except if returning to their place of origin).

Exhibitors are required to supply a completed waybill, the PIC of origin and the PIC of destination. All cattle entering the Brookfield Showgrounds must be fully recorded on the Cattle transfers Form 'A' and be returned to the Chief Steward with the nominations. Judging for the Small breed stud beef competition will commence at 9am Sunday 16th May 2010.

Stalls (uncovered) are available overnight. Bedding and feed to be supplied by exhibitor, (available from Brookfield Produce). All cattle must be tractable. All single exhibits must lead and tie up or they will not be judged.

All Bulls 12 months old and over must have a nose ring or nose clip and be in the charge of the exhibitor or their employee. It is the owner's responsibility to maintain control of their exhibits at all times.

All dams exhibiting a calf at foot, the calf must be 8 months or under and can not be shown as an individual exhibit.

Entry forms together with nomination fees to be lodged with the Chief Steward, PO Box 63, Bellbowrie Q 4070. Entries close last post **Tuesday 11th May 2010.**

All adult animals must be fully accepted for registration in the Stud herd book of their respective breeds and proof of registration must be available if requested. All animals not of age for registration must be progeny of registered Sires and Dams and recorded in the Calf register of the respective Breed Societies. Proof of the foregoing must be supplied in every case.

Age for classes will be that of the animal on 1st May 2010.

Due to changes in the Show Society rule – no free entry to the show will be permitted.

The following classes are open to all breeds. Breeds are to be judged separately within their classes, except Interbreed Champion Male and Female and Exhibitors group.

All class winners will be awarded ribbons irrespective of number in class.

All Champion and Reserve champion will receive sashes however monetary prize will only be awarded if more than 3 entries from separate stud breeders.

Grand Champion sashes and rosettes will be awarded in all individual breeds however monetary prize will on be awarded if more than 3 entries are awarded from separate stud breeders.

Interbreed Champions will be awarded rosette however monetary prize will be awarded only if more than 2 entries.

The Show Society is required by the Tax Laws to deduct 48.5% of all prize money of \$50 or more if you do not quote your ABN or sign a hobby declaration form:

Power outlets will be available provided that exhibitors use RCD units (E.L.C.B) and certified leads (in accordance with Australian standard No. 3760).

Cattle tick treatment for stock returning to clean areas. Brookfield Showground does not have an approved livestock spraying facility. Exhibitors returning to the cattle tick protected and free areas will need to contact the DPI.

Animals must originate from a Johnes Disease protected area or MM1,2 or 3 herd.

The rulings of the Stewards will be adhered to at all times.

The Stewards have the power to remove any animal from the judging ring if that animal is a danger to the safety of the public.

Led Steer competition: All steers to be weighed by 8am prior to judging. Judging will take place in the Cattle stud section commencing at 9am. Steers which have been treated with hormones are not eligible for entry. All steers must be milk tooth and showing no signs of permanent incisors
